<u>Course Description</u>: Forensic Investigation constructs a bridge between basic criminal investigation and forensic science. The course will take forensic evidence, amplify it, collect it, process it and bring it into a Forensic Laboratory. Scientific methods will be explained and evidence examination techniques will be explored.
